I am proud to present the City of South Salt Lake Neighborhood Resource Guide. We often say that South Salt Lake is where people get their start - build or buy a first home, start a business, often move here from another city or country. I believe we are a city of opportunity. My personal path from my first job with the city at age 19 to becoming Mayor is a simple story of watching for opportunities and working hard to get to the next step.

Our community has always taken a similar approach - seeing opportunities and working hard to get there. When I became mayor, we came together to identify our toughest challenges and biggest needs. I decided then to make three promises, representing our highest hopes, to the community:

- 1. Everyone has the opportunity to attend and graduate from college.
- 2. Everyone has a safe, clean home and neighborhood.
- 3. Everyone has the opportunity to be healthy and prosper.

With this inspiration, we began our Promise South Salt Lake Department and invited everyone to help us achieve these promises. Now with over 100 community partners, grant funding, and donations, we have achieved remarkable things, including a 64% decrease in youth crime during after school hours; a drop in youth gang involvement from 25.6% to 7.2%; a 16% increase in high school graduation rate among English-language learners; and a marked improvement in individual and community pride.

South Salt Lake was founded as the "City of Industry", based on the natural advantages and economic hub for the entire valley. Seventy-nine years later, we are guiding change of the city to welcome the unprecedented new growth and opportunity. We are building a downtown, a walkable urban neighborhood on the streetcar line, and adding new jobs and businesses each week. We are truly living up to our new motto of a "City on the Move."

We hope this guide will assist South Salt Lake residents, as well as neighbors and agencies that partner with these individuals, in providing timely access to needed services. We hope it inspires you to be a part of your community and helps point you in the right direction. I encourage you to get involved, and make your voice heard. On behalf of everyone who works for and with the city of South Salt Lake, thank you for giving us the opportunity to serve.


